North Bay ready to shine in the 2010 Olympic Torch Relay

North Bay, Ontario — In just 21 days from today, the eyes of the world will turn to our city as the Olympic Flame arrives in North Bay as part of the Vancouver 2010 Olympic Torch Relay, presented by Coca-Cola and RBC and supported by the Government of Canada.

“Everywhere you look in North Bay, excitement is building for the arrival of the Olympic Flame and everyone is invited to come out and cheer it on its journey to Vancouver,” said Mayor Vic Fedeli. “On December 30th, we’re expecting thousands to turn out for this emotional once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to see the Olympic Flame in person right here in our city and feel inspired by its universal message of peace, brotherhood and friendship.”

The torch relay will arrive at approximately 6:04 pm as part of a convoy of vehicles, which will include torchbearer shuttles, media vehicles, relay support vehicles and police cruisers. Temporary rolling road closures will ensure the safety of the torchbearers and spectators lining the relay route. The crowd will see a new torchbearer carry the flame every 300 metres through the community as it travels on its 45,000-kilometre-long journey across Canada — the longest domestic torch relay in Olympic history.

To celebrate the arrival of the flame, the community is planning an array of stage entertainment that includes an aboriginal welcome, The Interlink Choir, Dreamcoat Theatre, Renata Dolata, Nishnaabe Eshkiniijig & Spirit Star Singers. The Widdifield High School Choir will be performing the national anthem in both French & English.

There will also be performances, interactive displays and giveaways by sponsors including Coca-Cola & RBC. Crowds will be dazzled by a spectacular grand finale fireworks display. Admission is free to the public and the first 1000 people will receive a free treat of toffee on snow. Dress warmly and help paint the town red by wearing your red clothing.

As part of our community celebration, Nicholas Fung has been named as North Bay’s community torchbearer for the Vancouver 2010 Olympic Torch Relay. He will have the honour of lighting the community cauldron during the show.

Nicholas Fung, 13, is a student at Chippewa Intermediate/Secondary School and is known in the community for his unwavering desire to be a hockey goalie which was the impetus behind Northern Ontario’s only special Needs hockey team, the North Bay North Stars. Nicholas has a very sweet disposition and a disarming innocence and leaves a positive impression on most people he interacts with. He is happy with a great sense of humour, involved in his community and connected uniquely to the world around him. What makes him so remarkable is that he has managed to do so despite having challenges that affect the way he thinks and learns.

“Our goal with these celebrations has always been to bring the magic and excitement of the Olympic Spirit home to millions of Canadians no matter where they live and truly make these Canada’s Games,” said John Furlong, Chief Executive Officer of the Vancouver Organizing Committee for the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games (VANOC).

The 106-day Olympic Torch Relay will visit more than 1,030 communities and places of interest in every province and territory. On February 12, 2010, the Olympic Flame will make its way to

downtown Vancouver to light the Olympic Cauldron in a magical and awe-inspiring moment before a television audience of three billion people worldwide, signalling the kick off to the start of the Vancouver 2010 Olympic Winter Games.
